

COOKIES NOTICE

Last Updated August 20, 2026

This Cookies Notice describes how Workbox Holdings, Inc. (together with its subsidiaries, “**Workbox**”, “**we**”, “**our**” or “**us**”) uses cookies and similar technologies when you visit our website, including the pages, features and content we own or operate (the “**Site**”), or interact with Workbox online advertisements (collectively, the “**Online Services**”). It also explains what these technologies are and why we use them, as well as your rights to control our use of them.

Like many businesses that operate online, we may gather and store personal data, such as your IP address, browser and device characteristics, operating system, language preferences, referring URLs, and geolocation, through cookies and similar technologies. Please read our [Privacy Policy](#) for more information about how we collect and process your personal data and your rights in relation thereto.

1. WHAT ARE COOKIES?

Cookies are small data files sent by a website to your web browser to store on your computer, mobile phone or other device in order to remember information about you. When you return to these websites using the same device and web browser, or visit other websites that use the same cookies, the websites are able to recognize your device and preferences. By themselves, cookies do not identify you specifically. Rather, they recognize your browser or device. Cookies can retrieve only the information that they have stored on your device; they cannot access any other information about you from your device.

Cookies that are set by the website operator are called first-party cookies. These cookies often store information relevant to the website you’re visiting, such as what you have viewed in the past and your settings preferences, and are generally used to improve your online user experience. Examples of first-party cookies are user authentication cookies, language preference cookies, session cookies, site preference cookies, and website analytics cookies.

Cookies that are set by parties other than the website operator are called third-party cookies. These cookies are usually embedded in ads, videos and banners and track your behavior for online advertising purposes. Third-party cookies are accessible on any website that loads the third-party server’s code. Examples of third-party cookies are behavioral advertising cookies, cross-site tracking cookies, social media integration cookies, affiliate marketing cookies, and retargeting cookies.

2. WHAT TYPES OF COOKIES DO WE USE?

We use the following types of cookies:

COOKIE TYPE	DESCRIPTION
Strictly Necessary Cookies	These cookies are essential for the basic functioning of the Site and cannot be switched off. They are typically set in response to actions made by you, such as setting your privacy preferences, logging in, or filling in forms, and are used only for the specific purposes for which they were set. You can set your browser to block or alert you about these cookies, but if you block them, some parts of the Site may not work.
Performance & Analytics Cookies	These cookies allow us to count visits, time spent, bounce rates, and traffic sources so we can measure and improve the performance of the Site. They help us to know which pages are the most and least popular and see how visitors move around the Site. All information these cookies collect is aggregated and anonymous. If you do not allow these cookies, we will not know when you have visited the Site or be able to see how you move around the Site.
Functional Cookies	These cookies enable us to remember the choices you make so we can provide you with a smoother and more personalized interaction with our Online Services. They bridge the gap between basic functionality and a superior browsing experience. For example, functional cookies can remember your preferences (e.g., country or language selection), settings and login credentials.
Targeting & Advertising Cookies	These cookies gather information about you in order to show you more relevant, targeted ads based on your browsing behavior and to help us measure the effectiveness of our advertising campaigns. They may be set by our third-party advertising partners to display advertising on the Site or to track user behavior for purposes of advertising on third-party websites that may be of interest to you. The information collected by these cookies does not enable us or our advertising partners to identify your name, contact details, or other personal data that directly identifies you, but is based on uniquely identifying your device and web browser. If you do not allow these cookies, you will experience less advertising tailored to your inferred interests on the Site and will not receive targeted Workbox advertisements on third-party websites.
Social Media Cookies	These cookies are set by social media platforms like Twitter, Facebook, Instagram, and LinkedIn that we have integrated into the Site to enable you to share our content with your friends and networks. They can track your browser activity across other websites and build a profile of your interests, potentially impacting the content and messages you see on those websites. If you do not allow these cookies, you may not be able to use or see these sharing tools.

3. WHY DO WE USE COOKIES?

Like many businesses that operate online, we use common information-gathering technologies such as cookies, web beacons and other similar tracking technologies to automatically collect information as you access the Site and Online Services. We use these technologies to better understand how you navigate

and interact with the Site and Online Services and to make your experience more efficient, easy and meaningful for you.

We use first-party and third-party cookies to recognize you as a Workbox customer, enable your use and access of the Site and Online Services, customize and improve the Site and Online Services (e.g., to remember your username, language or other preferences), optimize and measure the effectiveness of our advertising campaigns, better understand your use of the Site, and collect information about your computer or other device to help prevent fraud and promote the safety and security of the Site.

The information we collect from cookies includes:

- aggregated information that does not specifically identify you, including statistical information about how you use the Site and Online Services and information linked to a cookie ID or other identification that is not paired in our records with your identifiable information; and
- information automatically collected about you, your computer or device when you visit the Site and Online Services, including your browser type and operating system and information regarding the content you view and features you access on the Site and Online Services.

We may also use cookies on the Site and Online Services that enable our third-party service providers (e.g., social media companies and advertising partners) to assist us in displaying ads specific to your interests across the internet. However, as we do not control the types of information collected and stored by these third-party cookies, you should refer to the third-party's website for more information.

4. HOW LONG WILL COOKIES STAY ON YOUR DEVICE?

The length of time a cookie will stay on your browsing device depends on whether it is a "session" or a "persistent" cookie. Session cookies are temporary and only stay on your device until you close your browser. Persistent cookies stay on your hard drive until you manually delete them or they reach a set expiration date. Persistent cookies are sometimes called tracking cookies because they collect user information, such as browsing habits and preferences, over a longer period of time.

5. WHAT OTHER SIMILAR TECHNOLOGIES DO WE USE?

We may use other technologies that function similar to cookies to track users of the Site and Online Services. Accordingly, when we use the word 'cookies' in this Cookies Notice, we refer to cookies and all other similar technologies, which may include:

- **Web Beacons, Pixel Tags and Trackers.** Web beacons (or "**clear gifs**"), pixel tags and tracking URLs are tiny graphic images and/or small blocks of code with a unique identifier placed on a website or advertisement. These technologies allow us to track your online movements when you interact with the Site and Online Services. In contrast to cookies, which are stored on your computer or other device, these technologies are embedded invisibly on web pages. We and our third-party service providers employ these technologies for the purposes stated above, but primarily to help us better manage content on the Site and Online Services by informing us which content is effective.
- **Flash Cookies.** Flash cookies (also known as local shared objects or "**LSOs**") are small data files placed on your computer using Adobe Flash technology. The Adobe Flash Player is an application that allows rapid development of dynamic content, such as video clips and animation. We use Flash cookies to personalize and enhance your online experience and to deliver content

for Flash players, but may also use them for security purposes, to gather certain website metrics, and to help remember settings and preferences.

- **Google Analytics.** Google Analytics uses cookies and similar technologies to collect and analyze information about your use of the Site and Online Services and report on activities and trends. It enables us to understand your interactions with other websites, applications and online resources. You can learn more about Google Analytics by visiting Google's website.

6. HOW CAN YOU MANAGE COOKIES, TARGETED ONLINE ADVERTISING AND OTHER TRACKING TECHNOLOGIES?

Cookies

To opt-out from the collection of cookies, targeted online advertising and other tracking technologies on the Site, you will need to manage your cookies settings at the browser and/or device level. Browser and device-level settings may allow you to: (i) delete all cookies; (ii) block all cookies; (iii) allow all cookies; (iv) block "third-party" cookies; (v) block cookies from a specific domain; (vi) clear all cookies when you close the browser; (vii) open a "private browsing/incognito" session; and/or (viii) install add-ons and plugins that extend browser functionality. To manage your cookies settings at the browser level, follow the instructions provided by your browser (usually located within the "Help," "Tools," or "Edit" settings). Various browsers may also offer their own management tools for removing HTML5 local storage.

To manage privacy and storage settings for Flash cookies, which can only be done through a different interface than the one provided by your web browser, click [here](#). You can also control Flash cookies by going to the global storage settings panel and following the instructions. Setting the Adobe Flash Player to restrict or limit acceptance of Flash cookies may restrict your access to certain content and may reduce or impede the functionality of some Flash applications, including Flash applications used in connection with the Site and Online Services.

Additional tools available to manage third-party cookies include the websites of the Digital Advertising Alliance (DAA) or the Network Advertising Initiative (NAI), of which many advertising companies that collect information for interest-based advertising are members. If you choose to opt out using these tools, you may continue to receive advertisements but they will not be tailored to your interests.

Please note that by blocking or deleting cookies and other tracking technologies, you may not be able to access all or parts of the Site and Online Services or take full advantage of the functionality provided by the Site (e.g., remembering your username or having Workbox locations displayed that are closest to where you are located).

Personalized Mobile Advertising

You can opt out of having your mobile advertising identifiers used for certain types of advertising by accessing the appropriate settings on your mobile device and following the instructions. If you opt out, we will remove all data about you and will not collect any further data. The random ID previously assigned to you will be removed. If at a later date, you decide to opt in, we will be unable to track you using your previous ID and you will be, for all intents and purposes, a new user. To control interest-based tracking on

iOS devices, go to Settings > Privacy & Security > Apple Advertising > toggle “Personalized Ads” on or off. For Android devices, go to Settings > Google services > Ads > toggle “Opt out of Ads Personalization” on or off. For both iOS and Android devices, you can also reset the advertising identifier that is currently assigned to you.

Do Not Track

While most web browsers and some mobile operating systems and mobile applications offer a Do-Not-Track ("DNT") feature or setting that lets you tell websites that you do not want to have your online browsing activities monitored and collected, these features are not yet uniform and no common technology standard for recognizing and implementing DNT signals has been adopted by industry groups, technology companies, or regulators. Therefore, we do not currently participate in any DNT frameworks that would allow us to respond to browser signals or any other mechanism that automatically communicates your choice not to be tracked online.
